Katie Wood, Downtown Naperville Alliance, 55 S. Main Street, #351, explained the purpose of the system as providing background music to enhance the ambiance of the downtown and improve the overall downtown experience. She said it would be primarily used for special events and the holiday season and played in the Central Business District.

Council stated that people already linger in the downtown, asked about how music will be selected, and if special needs triggers were considered.

Wood responded that the system is controlled by zones and the sound can be increased or decreased based on area activity.

Council asked about feedback from downtown businesses, royalties, hours that music will be played, and the location of speakers. Council also stated that the current system is not practical, that music on the Riverwalk is not supported, and that music may not be appropriate near restaurants.


