2011 Pace Express Route Service Agreements

Steve Chirico, 1205 Kimball Court, suggested that routes with limited ridership be evaluated.

Robles stated that Route 672 was initiated as part of the city's multi modal approach to providing access to the train station. She said Council directed staff to increase transit services to train stations and PACE agreed to provide the services as part of a 50/50 cost share.

Council stated this service is enabling people to go downtown to their jobs, and that these routes are funded through parking permit holders and daily parking fees, not property or sales tax. Council also asked that staff aggressively market these routes.

By consensus, Council approved the use of \$180,000 leaving a gap of \$120,000.

Council discussed funding for Century Walk and NCC Sesquicentennial, questioned the fairness of using a limited number of selected events to close the gap, possibly reallocating all SECA funding, applying an equal reduction to all recipients that require city services, and reducing the Carillon repayment by \$120,000.

Krieger responded that the budget that was passed in agenda item J1 includes the \$600,000 Carillon repayment and cannot be reduced without amending the budget.

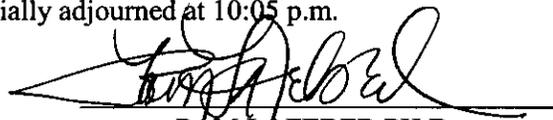
